



Information for Radio Stations

Climate Connections is a daily (M-F), 90-second radio program, currently broadcast on more than 340 stations across the United States. The program helps listeners understand how climate change is already impacting our lives, and what diverse people and organizations are doing to reduce the associated risks. The series “connects the dots” between climate change and energy, extreme weather, public health, food and water, jobs and the economy, national security, and the creative arts, among other topics.

Launched August 18, 2014, *Climate Connections* is hosted by Anthony Leiserowitz, Ph.D., Director of the Yale Center for Environmental Communication, edited by veteran environmental journalists Bud Ward and Sara Peach, and produced by ChavoBart Digital Media. Funding is provided by the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation and the Grantham Foundation for the Protection of the Environment.
